Review of Cyber Safety Week

Month 6 Meeting 13

Students will reflect on the success of their Cyber Safety Awareness Week activities and prepare for peer-to-peer presentations in elementary and middle schools.

CYBER SWAT

Objectives

- Complete presentation preparation for elementary and middle school weeks.
- Identify (at least) three things that went well.
- Identify three things the group wants to do differently next year.

Materials

 Materials needed for presentation prep (access to PowerPoint, poster board, or handouts for the elementary students

Review and Reflect

Take a moment to let the team discuss the successes of Cyber Safety Awareness Week and what could have been done differently. Make notes so the team can return to them when planning next year's Cyber Safety Awareness Week activities.

Additionally, team officers can create a short survey for team members regarding Cyber Safety Awareness Week. There are several free online platforms-- such as Survey Monkey or Google Forms-- that would make gathering information fairly simple.

Presentation Prep

- With the remaining time, have students work on their presentations for the middle and elementary school visits.
- Confirm dates and times.
- Clarify any outstanding questions team members may have.

Things to consider

• This is a good time to discuss appropriate communication with younger groups and answering questions the middle and elementary school students may ask. This should include how the team, SRO(s), and any other educators present will respond in cases where students disclose sensitive information. State law, school district policy, and other factors may affect the way SROs, educators, counselors, or other adults respond to these kinds of disclosures. Be sure you are aware of your responsibilities, if any, as a mandatory reporter.
